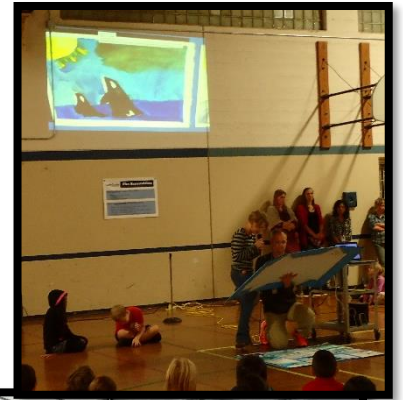


TAKING ACTION: Sharing Ideas Through Art
